# Olympic boost for **China aviation**

Olympic Games THE this August is set to give aviation industry China's a big boost, said a report. The Shanghai Daily, quoting information from the General Administration of Civil Aviation, said domestic carriers plan to fly 210 million passengers this year, a 14% jump from a year earlier. Five million overseas visitors and more than 120 million domestic travellers are expected to visit Beijing this year, according to the organisers of the Beijing Olympic Games. Analysts quoted by the daily predicted that the event would generate revenue of RMB5 billion (US\$689 million) to the domestic aviation industry.
